



Secwepemc Health Caucus Social Determinants of Health Technician Internal / External Posting



The Secwepemc Health Caucus (SHC) is looking for a Social Determinants of Health Technician to join their team. The Social Determinants of Health Technician will be responsible for supporting the delivery of the plan's goals and objectives as determined by the Secwepemc Chiefs and Health Directors. This individual is accountable to the Secwepemc Health Caucus through the direct professional supervision and support provided by the SHC Nation Health Manager and the SHC Operations Manager. This position is a full-time term position ending November 2021, with the potential of extension contingent on funding.

Relevant Knowledge and Abilities

- Ability to effectively prioritize and execute multiple tasks simultaneously in a high-pressure environment while maintaining effectiveness and efficiency;
- Build Relationships, establish and maintain positive working relationships with others, both internally and externally, to achieve the goals of the organization;
- Identify and develop a database of social determinants of health resources to promote equity and access;
- Collaborate on the draft and implementation of a Nation based mental wellness communication plan to support crises;
- Ability to communicate effectively both orally and in writing;
- Knowledge of provincial and federal health systems, and First Nations health system needs;

Requirements and Qualifications:

- A degree in Social Work or related health field, or an acceptable combination of education, training and experience;
- A minimum of 3 years' experience with project management, planning and monitoring preferably in a First Nations setting;
- Experience working with First Nations communities/organizations including leadership and knowledge keepers;
- Ability to efficiently and effectively utilize Microsoft Office Suite including Word, Outlook, PowerPoint and Excel;
- Familiar with Secwepemc culture and traditions.
- Must be able to work flexible hours and travel as required;
- Possess a valid driver's license with a reliable vehicle.

In accordance with the SNTC Human Resource Policy, the first priority will be to hire qualified persons of Secwepemc ancestry. Pursuant to section 41 of the BC Human Rights Code, preference may be given to applicants of Aboriginal ancestry.
