



Shuswap Nation Tribal Council Secwepemc Nation Building Initiative Cultural Coordinator Internal/External Posting

The Shuswap Nation Tribal Council, also known as the SNTC, was formed in 1980 as an effort of the Secwepemc chiefs to advance the issues of aboriginal rights. We are looking for a Secwepemc Nation Building Initiative (SNBI) Cultural Coordinator to carry out the cultural workplan and promote the Secwepemc traditions, customs and culture tasks in a friendly, courteous and helpful manner.

The Position:

The Shuswap Nation Tribal Council is looking for a dynamic individual for the position of SNBI Cultural Coordinator. The SNBI Cultural Coordinator will provide coordination support to the Language and Cultural Manager when requested, in the cultural program of the Governance Department with a goal to revive Secwepemc culture, traditions and protocols for the Secwepemc Nation.

Relevant Knowledge and Abilities

- Extensive knowledge with Secwepemc culture and traditions; including training in Secwepemc cultural and traditional practices
- Knowledge of past and current practices as it relates to the health (mental, emotional, physical and spiritual) of First Nations people.
- Strong analytical, communication skills and knowledge of research practices;
- Identify definitions of traditional wellness and wellness indicators;
- Knowledge of Secwepemc drumming and singing.
- Ability to use with proficiency, the Microsoft Office Suite.

Requirements and Qualifications:

- Minimum 2 years experience or an acceptable combination of education, training, and experience;
- Community Development Experience in Cultural practices;
- Must be able to work flexible hours and travel as required;
- Possess a valid driver's licence with a reliable vehicle;
- Preference will be given to applicants with extensive experience working with Secwepemc communities in cultural revitalization.

In accordance with the SNTC Human Resource Policy, the first priority will be to hire qualified persons of Secwepemc ancestry. Pursuant to section 41 of the BC Human Rights Code, preference may be given to applicants of Aboriginal ancestry.
